The path here was considerably more overgrown with thick bramble – which got a good cut back to re-establish a way back to the cricket pitches.

There were lots of wildflowers around these paths and we left most of it alone and hopefully in a much better position to get more sunlight after nettles and brambles were removed. We spotted potentilla, guem, geranium, and hedge woundwort in abundance.






After the paths around the cricket pitches we finished off the path between Nursery Grove and the bottom of Brook Lane.
