

We removed the summer growth from all overhanging plants and shrubs along the pathway to bring in more light. We also removed nettles and brambles from the pavements where it was growing in the leaf debris.

We also cleared a considerable amount of branches from around the street light to allow more lighting to be seen on the winter nights. We then cleared lots of ivy growing alongside and over the top of the jitty at the corner. Lots more light now at this point



At the bottom of the jitty, towards Sileby Road end, we just cut back the summer overgrowth, but it made a big difference. A bag of rubbish collected from this short jitty alone!



We then moved onto the Sileby Road to Avon Road jitty and cut back a fairly large stretch of hawthorn, so much safer to use now.
